An Update from Commissioner Ken Heil on the City of Union

Hello Citizens of the City of Union,

My name is Ken Heil and I am serving my second term as a City Commissioner. I am proud to serve our city and our citizens.

As part of my duties as Commissioner, I work as the chair of the Public Works committee for the city. We are in an exciting time for the City of Union and I would like to let you know about what you can expect in the coming months.

The Mt. Zion road project will be starting soon. Bids are in the process of being reviewed now, and the winning bidder will be working hard almost immediately. The project will be in phases, and I will be meeting monthly with the contractor and the State Transportation Cabinet to give updates on the project. I will be sharing those updates on our city website and through our city social media accounts as well. One of the first projects will be the installation of lights along the highway, with nearly 100 lights scheduled to be installed by March.

Any time there is road construction, there can be issues, but we will do our best to let everyone know as things progress if there are any areas to be aware of, or to allow extra travel time for. Remember that it is a state law to obey all traffic signs and signals, and slow down and allow for the construction crews to do their work safely. Working together, we can all make this project great for the City of Union.

Another public works project that is underway is our street repair project. I am happy to report that it remains ahead of schedule, and we are addressing issues as quickly as we can. The city has also begun work on the fence repair on Rice Pike near the Lassing Green subdivision. The new vinyl fencing is certainly an improvement on the old, and will be better for maintenance in the future as well. This work will be completed shortly.
