It has been awhile since my last State of the Union...Union, KY update, and I would like to take this opportunity to update you on our beautiful city. We have had a lot of important achievements in Union over the past three years.

- The new Route 536/Mt. Zion Road is now underway. We hope for an early 2019 completion. As a result of action by local, county and state officials, this project was placed back onto the 2017-18 State's Budget and not postponed to the 2020-21 Budget as the State planned to do.
- Our administration has stimulated a lot of business growth in Union, with the addition of the new Kroger Marketplace, new restaurants, bars and other small businesses expanding to historic Union...those now open and those planned to be open in the near future.
- Our administration is focused on responsible growth while maintaining a small-town feel....where
